Volunteer Coordinator



Outdoor Exhibition Opportunity in San Rafael

Marin's premier non-profit art center, Art Works Downtown, includes 4 galleries, 35 art studios, a café, a jewelers guild, a frame shop, a ceramic center, other arts organizations, 17 affordable apartments and more in a 40,000 square-foot building on Fourth Street in San Rafael, a well-to-do community with a charming downtown, many vibrant night spots and a lot of daytime vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

In addition to monthly exhibits, events and classes, they have outreach programs and six public art installation sites. Since 2007 they have sponsored the Public Sculpture Program, with the objectives of exhibiting works by San Francisco Bay Area sculptors and using the vitality of public sculpture to revitalize downtown San Rafael's business district.



I have participated in this program for several years, and have found it a great opportunity for exposure of outdoor works by mid-career sculptors. I have sold my work, prior to the end of the exhibition. Works priced below \$1,000 probably have a good chance of selling. They take no commission on sales.

Art Works Downtown seeks to expand its cadre of sculptors for shows later this year and in 2015. Application is simple and free. They provide good PR coverage with images of exhibited works on their website, a monthly newsletter and Facebook. Installation is easy; they are fairly helpful, flexible, and provide a reasonable stipend to help defer installation and removal

costs.
